Roger VanFleteren

ALABAMA BALLET ASSOCIATE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Roger VanFleteren, Associate Artistic Director, is a native of Michigan where he began his training at the age of twelve with

Charmaine Shick. VanFleteren is a former American Ballet Theater soloist and also performed as a principal dancer with the London City Ballet. VanFleteren has performed in repertoire by Kenneth MacMillan, Twyla Tharp, George Balanchine, and Mikhail Baryshnikov and danced the title role in Agnes De Mille's last ballet, "The Other".

VanFleteren began his career at Alabama Ballet with Wes Chapman in 1996 as Ballet Master and Resident Choreographer. His original choreography for Alabama Ballet includes "Romeo and Juliet", "Dracula", "Swan Lake", "Cinderella", "Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde" and "Bonnie and Clyde." VanFleteren's original world premieres, "Bach Variations" and "Be Major" are two Panoply award winning works. "Concert Fantasy" premiered in March 2006 and was underwritten by the Alabama State Council on the Arts.

Alabama Public Television's documentary on Alabama Ballet's "Romeo and Juliet" was nominated for a Regional Emmy Award. VanFleteren's innovative choreography and passion for the dancer has been instrumental in the world-class performances by the company. VanFleteren was named an official ambassador for Alabama's 2007 Year of the Arts. VanFleteren worked with John McFall and the Atlanta Ballet in 2007. He was appointed Alabama Ballet Associate Artistic Director in 2008 and served as guest teacher with American Ballet Theatre II. He was commissioned to choreograph for ABT II in the Fall of 2009. Most recently, Roger choreographed the premiere of "Alice in Wonderland" with an original score by Les Filmer performed by the Alabama Symphony Orchestra. Other recent works for the Alabama Ballet include "Death and the Maiden" with the Alabama Symphony Orchestra, "Of One Voice", "Bonnie and Clyde", "1 and 5", "Shoo-Pah!" and "Rosen", dedicated in memory of Jason VanFleteren.

Aidan Nettles is an Assistant Professor of Dance at The University of Alabama. She holds a Bachelor of Arts (BA) in Dance from The University of Alabama and a Master of Fine Arts (MFA) with Distinction

from The University of Roehampton, London, UK.

With a comprehensive background in ballet, contemporary, and jazz, Professor Nettles imparts her knowledge to a diverse range of students, spanning from young children to budding university artists and scholars at both undergraduate and graduate levels. Throughout her career, she has choreographed and scored competitive programs and television performances, establishing a distinguished presence in dance.

Aidan Nettles is an ABT® Certified Teacher, who has successfully completed the ABT® Teacher Training Intensive in Pre-Primary through Level 5 of the ABT® National Training Curriculum. Her extensive contributions to the arts have been acknowledged both on national and international platforms, leading to numerous accolades that recognize her exceptional performance, choreographic expertise, and scholarly contributions.





Kendia Bennett, a native of Niagara Falls, New York, received his early training from Miss Beverly Fletcher before being accepted to the Alabama School of Fine Arts (ASFA) in Birmingham, Alabama. While attending ASFA, Kendia studied under David Keener, Rafael Delgado, Mimi Twyman, Martha Faesi and Jamie Kilgore. Kendia has attended Virginia

School of the Arts, Nashville Ballet, and Alabama Ballet summer intensive programs. Kendia participated in Alabama Ballet's Spring 2012 Showcase in which he choreographed "Beauty in Thanatos," choreographing many more pieces that have been performed by students of SUNY Purchase College such as "Off Balance," and "A Taste for Things to Come." He was thrilled to accept the position of apprentice with Alabama Ballet from 2011-2013. After studying dance at SUNY Purchase College for his BFA (2018). Having performed works by George Balanchine (pas de deux in "Four Temperaments"; "Nutcracker"), Taryn Russel, Norbert De La Cruz, and many more, Kendia is excited to be back in Birmingham to dance and give back to his community. After teaching at Alabama Dance Academy, under the direction of Pamela Merkel, Kendia is currently teaching at Ballet Squared in Gadsden, Alabama, and now, joining the Alabama Ballet this year for the first show of the season!

Juan Rafael Castellanos began his dance training in Dublin, Ireland, where he was born and continued in the U.S. at Metropolitan Ballet Academy in Jenkintown, Pennsylvania, under the Direction of Lisa Collins Vidnovic. As a member of their nationally acclaimed Boys' scholarship

Program, Juan's 11 years of study there included access to many world-class teachers and the opportunity to perform a variety of principal roles in both classical ballet and contemporary dance working with choreographers including Jessica Lang, Sarah Mettin, Kanji Segawa and Ashley Pabst. After graduation in 2019, Juan then joined the Charlotte Ballet Pre-Professional program under the Direction of Laszlo Berdo, Kati Mayo and Patricia McBride. Over the span of four years with Charlotte Ballet, Juan went through the ranks of the company through Charlotte Ballet II and finishing with the main company. With Charlotte Ballet he had the opportunity to perform pieces from many renowned choreographers including Christopher Stuart, Helen Pickett, Jennifer Archibald, and many others. This is Juan's second season with Alabama Ballet, and he can't wait for all the new works coming to Birmingham for this upcoming season.

Artistic Director

ABOUT CHRISTOPHER

Christopher Stuart, originally from Sandy Hook, CT, was first introduced to the Arts by his grandmother, who frequently took him to see performances of all types of ballet and musical theatre. This was where Christopher first fell in love with the stage. He began his formal training with Steve Sirico, Angela D'valda Sirico, Franco De Vita and Raymond Lukens, and now with a child of his own, he understands why the arts are so important to enriching our community, especially its children.

CAREER

In 2002 Christopher graduated from the **University of North Carolina School of the Arts**. Upon graduation he joined Nashville Ballet where he was featured in works by renowned choreographers such as Nashville Ballet's Artistic Director Paul Vasterling, Jiri Kylian, Gina Patterson, Christopher Bruce, Christopher Wheeldon and numerous others. After a 16-year career with Nashville Ballet as a principal dancer, choreographer, and teacher, he was appointed as their Resident Choreographer in 2018, creating over 10 works during his tenure. During this time Christopher concurrently taught and created new works for schools and companies all across America. His passion for teaching is rooted in his conviction to share the techniques and choreography that he has gleaned over his career.

Christopher's vast experience as a dancer and performer helped him articulate his choreographic voice through improvisation and exploration of different forms of movement. Embarking upon his journey as a choreographer has allowed him to further express himself in a free and limitless way. He has created works for Nashville Ballet, Ballet Arkansas, Chattanooga Ballet, National Choreographers Initiative, Charlotte Ballet, various festivals, and commercial work.

In 2014, he created *Under the Lights*, a full-length work to the music of Johnny Cash performed by **Sugar & The Hi-Lows** about which ArtsNash said "Stuart's choreography proved to be a seamless blend of classical, modern and popular dance styles." In 2015, Stuart had the pleasure of choreographing a piece to the music of the world-renowned **Fisk Jubilee Singers**.

Christopher brought music lovers and dance enthusiasts together by collaborating with some of the music industry's best including, **Maren Morris**, **Sheryl Crow**, **Ronnie Dunn** (Brooks & Dunn), **John Oates** (Hall & Oates), **Kellie Pickler**, and **John Carter Cash** (son of Johnny and June Carter Cash).

His artistic achievements won him the 2010 Tennessee Arts Commission Individual Artist Fellowship, one of the highest honors that a Tennessee artist can receive. Christopher was a finalist in Ballet Arkansas' 2014 Visions Choreographic Competition, as well as a finalist in the 17th Annual Choreography Festival which was held at the McCallum Theatre in Palm Desert, California. In 2016 and 2017 he was awarded a Fellowship Initiative Grant from the New York Choreographic Institute, an affiliate of New York City Ballet. In July 2017 he created a new work for the National Choreographer's Initiative in Irvine, California, and in the same year created a new work for Nashville Ballet entitled *The Raven* after Edgar Allan Poe's poem. In 2018, to rave reviews, Christopher created *Seven Deadly Sins* with new music written and sung by **Ten out of Tenn**, and the **Nashville Symphony**.

Christopher created for Charlotte Ballet's *Innovative Works* in 2020, inspired by the Mint Museum's installation of *Immersed in Light* by **studio DRIFT**.

Under the direction of Hope Muir, Christopher was appointed Director Charlotte Ballet II and Rehearsal Director for the main Company in July of 2020. In 2021, he served as

interim artistic director.

During his time at Nashville Ballet, Upleger has performed roles from such varied repertoire as Romeo inRomeo & Juliet, Prince Siegfried in Swan Lake, Albrecht in Giselle, Prince Desire in Sleeping Beauty, Prince Charming in Cinderella, the Sugar Plum Cavalier in Nashville's Nutcracker and Dracula in Paul Vasterling's Dracula.

Other leading roles include Stanley Kowalski in Annabelle Lopez Ochoa's American premiere of A Streetcar Named Desire, Christopher Wheeldon's Ghosts, Jiri Kylian's Petite Mort and Sechs Tanze, Twyla Tharp's Sinatra Suite, Salvatore Aiello's Satto, the Protagonist in Vasterling's Firebird, Oberon in AMidsummer Night's Dream, and Christopher Stuart's Under the Lights and 7 Deadly Sins. He has also had the honor of working with Christopher Bruce, Jennifer Archibald, Gina Patterson and Val Caniparoli.

After performing Upleger became a rehearsal director with Nashville ballet.

While teaching at the School of Nashville Ballet Upleger helped create the Young Men's Scholarship Program, which provides tuition-free ballet training for males age 6-18, and served as a Principal Instructor.

In 2021 he opened the Grand Rapids School of Dance. He is happy to be back in his home state bringing the joy of dance to the Grand Rapids Community with his wife, Alexandra, and sons, Hudson and Blake.

Alexandra Upleger trained in Ohio under Ana Lobe until 2008 when she joined Nashville Ballet. She danced with the company until 2018, during which time she performed principal roles in Nashville's Nutcracker, Sleeping Beauty, Swan Lake, Dracula, Peter Pan, Cinderella and Western Symphony. She also performed leading rolesin ballets by Christopher Bruce and Jiri Kylian and had the pleasure of working with Christopher Wheeldon, Brian Enos, Darrell Moultrie, Gina Patterson, James Sewell and Christopher Stuart.

In 2018 she joined the Grand Rapids Ballet. Performance highlights have included Tatiana and Helena in Christopher Stowell's A Midsummer Night's Dream, Dark Angel

and Russian Girl in Serenade, Jumping Girl in Who Cares and Principal Girl in Balanchine's Allegro Brillante, principal woman in Adam Hougland's Cold Virtues, the ensemble of Trey McIntyre's Wild Sweet Love and the title role in Yuri Possokhov's Firebird. 


